<p><b>Scientific and professional field/Professional experience:</b></p> <p>Erika Marsi Vice President of ITCB (International Training Center for Bankers) has acquired more than 35 years' experience in banking and finance. Her main responsibility relates to development of training and consulting activities with special regard to regulation.</p> <p>Before joining ITCB's staff in 2007, she has been holding various financial executive positions at e.g. the National Bank of Hungary, the Banking Supervision, an investment bank, as well as at a large international commercial bank. In 2004-2007, she served as Director General of the Hungarian Supervisory Authority, which, as a separate integrated supervision, was in charge not only of credit institutions but also that of investment banks, insurance companies and pension funds. In 2009, upon request of the Government, she became under-secretary of state at the Ministry of Finance. In this capacity and in close cooperation with IMF and the EU, she managed and coordinated governmental regulatory and other measures related to the financial crisis. In January 2010, she finished her government assignment and returned to ITCB. She is the leading teacher of ITCB in the field Basel III (CRD IV- CRR) and macro-prudential trainings.</p>
