Gyula Pleschinger graduated at the Faculty of Civil Engineering of the Budapest University of Technology, and then earned a degree in finance at the Budapest University of Economics. Following several years of experience at companies and local authorities, he was appointed Deputy Head of the Investment Department at OTP Bank in 1989. He was Chief Executive Officer of OTP Securities between 1990 and 2000, before moving on to become Deputy Chief Executive Officer in charge of the investment banking and investment services areas of Raiffeisen Bank between 2001 and 2004. From 2005 to September 2010 he worked as an independent investment adviser.

Between September 2010 and November 2011 he held the position of Chief Executive Officer of the Government Debt Management Agency. From November 2011 he served as State Secretary for tax and financial affairs at the Ministry for National Economy. In March 2013 he was appointed a Member of the Monetary Council of the Magyar Nemzeti Bank.

He became President of the Hungarian Economic Association (MKT) with effect of May, 2017.
